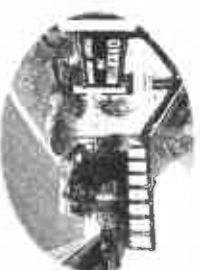
## Tea Room

Welcome to our Great Northern Railway Tea Room here at Overton Station. Please make yourself comfortable at our wait for one of our station volunteers to come round to take your order.

We have a selection of food and drink available on our menu. Why not relax with a pot of freshly brewed tea or maybe enjoy a slice of cake? Try our Victoria sponge, named so as it was a personal favourite of Queen Victoria herself.

The room is themed around the Great Northern Railway (GNR) which was formed in 1847, ten years into Queen Victoria's reign. Some of the furniture, even the chairs you are sitting in also share a Victorian heritage.

The station building you are sat in was originally a GNR Goods Office and was situated at Fleton Junction, south of Peterborough on the Main Line to London. In 1999 it was reopened on this site after being moved brick-by-brick. The original station building at Overton was demolished shortly after the line here closed to passengers in 1966.
